

Teaming Up for Change: The Face Behind Volunteer For 15

The Volunteer For 15 program, a dynamic partnership between Youth Volunteer Corps (YVC) and Patrick Mahomes' 15 and the Mahomies Foundation, inspires young leaders to make a real difference. With Patrick's example on and off the field, this initiative encourages youth to complete at least 15 hours of service annually, showing the power of one person's impact.

In 2024, 1,972 youth rose to the challenge, completing over 80,446 service hours—an incredible \$2.6 million in value to their communities. From building playgrounds to tackling food insecurity, these young volunteers make game-changing plays in their neighborhoods, proving that when youth step up, everyone wins.













The Faces Leading the Way:

The International Youth Advisory Board (IYAB) brings together passionate young leaders from across the YVC Network. Serving as YVC's sounding board, IYAB members meet monthly to share perspectives on youth recruitment, innovative service projects, leadership development, and tackling current community issues. Their influence extends far beyond discussion; IYAB members shape key YVC initiatives, like YVC Day, annual youth grants, and marketing strategies.

Through their roles, IYAB youth develop essential leadership skills, gain valuable experience, and make a tangible difference within the YVC Network and their communities. These committed young leaders are not only shaping YVC's future but are also building a legacy of service that will impact communities for years to come.








Faces of Change: Rudrani's Journey From Youth Service to Alumni Leader


Rudrani's journey is a powerful testament to YVC's impact on young lives—showing how a lifetime ethic of service can shape futures and empower leaders.

YVC and HALO Creating Impact Together

Youth Volunteer Corps of Kansas City (YVCKC) partnered with HALO to create a memorable, joy-filled experience for HALO youth and families this holiday season. Through this partnership, YVC youth volunteers played a central role in organizing the Giveback Boutique, where HALO kids could shop for clothing and gifts without the stress of money. Guided by YVC volunteers aged 11 to 18, the boutique offered a chance for youth to select outfits and personal items, all lovingly prepared by volunteers who sorted, steamed, and tagged donations to create a vibrant shopping experience.

YVC volunteers didn't just help with set-up; they were there with HALO families at every step, helping them find sizes, wrapping gifts, and providing a welcoming presence at the Hula Hoop register. The boutique was more than just a shopping experience; it reflected community, care, and support, helping HALO youth feel seen and celebrated.

This partnership between HALO and YVCKC embodies the community spirit, showing how the people behind the scenes—volunteers, local businesses, and community supporters—come together to make a lasting impact.







Faces of Community: Clean Water, Brighter Futures

Championing Change: YVC Kampala's Clean Water Initiative for St. Raphael's College

Youth volunteers from Youth Volunteer Corps Kampala, Uganda, have taken a monumental step toward addressing one of their community's critical needs: access to safe drinking water. Driven by their commitment to making a tangible difference, these volunteers recently installed a water purification system at St. Raphael's College, providing students with a reliable source of clean water for the first time

Before this initiative, students relied on rainwater collected in tanks that lacked proper treatment, risking their health. Installing the purification system was a significant achievement, supported by donations and technical guidance from Flex Electricals and Water Solutions, who worked closely with YVC youth to bring this project to life.

YVC of Kampala plans to continue installing water purification systems in other schools facing similar struggles.





Building a Legacy in Rural Communities

While many of our programs are in urban areas, YVC is familiar with rural communities. Powered by an investment from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation in 1990, YVC expanded from Kansas City to interested communities throughout the US and Canada. Alpena, Michigan, was one of these communities.

YVC Alpena began programming in 1992, making it one of the oldest programs in the network. In rural northern Michigan, Alpena (population 10,100) has engaged nearly 7,000 youth in 108,000 service hours in the past 20 years.

Faces of Community: Stories of Impact

Inspiring Future Educators: YVC's Impact at Cox High School

YVC of Hampton Roads partnered with Cox High School's Virginia Teachers for Tomorrow II class, guiding seniors in creating and leading service projects for younger students. Through a series of workshops beginning in September 2023, YVC instructed students on service-learning essentials, from identifying community needs to planning impactful projects and managing participants. By January, these seniors led 130 fifth graders in 10 projects that benefited local organizations, a testament to YVC's approach to service.

The impact of YVC's guidance went beyond the classroom: three seniors received teaching contracts with Virginia Beach City Public Schools. This powerful outcome highlights how YVC's program cultivates essential life skills, prepares youth for professional roles, and shapes the next generation of community leaders.










Catalysts for Change: Stories of Donor Impact

With generous support from the Berks County Community Foundation, YVC Reading, PA launched the Youth Mental Health Education Initiative, empowering youth to champion mental health awareness. This program engages 15 Youth Mental Health Ambassadors (YMHAs) in specialized training with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), teaching vital topics such as mental health awareness and suicide prevention.

Through this initiative, student ambassadors work closely with local partners to create a youth-led movement. This includes QPR suicide prevention training, a collaborative suicide prevention play with the Yocum Institute, and a youth-driven marketing campaign. By equipping youth to lead these essential projects, Berks County Community Foundation is helping to remove stigma and create a ripple of change in mental health support across Berks County.





Championing Change: Kemi's Leadership for Racial Equity

As a dedicated member of YVC Reading, Pennsylvania, Kemi has been instrumental in the **Stand Together Against Racism** (STAR) initiative. This initiative exemplifies YVC's mission to empower youth as agents of change in their communities.

Through STAR, Kemi has dedicated over 300 hours to educating her peers on the effects of racism, facilitating open dialogues, and fostering a culture of understanding and acceptance. She co-leads a weekly STAR discussion club at her high school and serves as a STAR Student Ambassador across Berks County, helping establish similar clubs in other schools. Under her leadership, STAR has initiated student-led film discussions, cultural awareness events, and interactive workshops, reaching hundreds of youth with its message of equity and understanding. Her leadership in advancing racial equity has earned her the prestigious Princeton Prize in Race Relations.



Catalysts for Change: Stories of Donor Impact

Roots of Change: Youth Volunteers Rock the Block

Fueled by the Sunderland Grant, 65 youth volunteers from YVC Racine, WI, came together to "Rock the Block" and give Villa Street in Racine a vibrant makeover. Over the week, volunteers worked tirelessly, picking up trash, landscaping, making minor repairs, painting, and power washing. They transformed over 20 homes, St. Catherine's High School, the COP House, Matranga's Food Mart, and various community spaces, creating a cleaner and more welcoming neighborhood.

Guided by professional tradespeople who volunteered their expertise, the youth learned valuable skills with hand tools and outdoor equipment while taking pride in their work and community. Kelly Fragassi, executive director of the Volunteer Center of Racine County, shared, "They're learning to care for others and their neighborhood." Inspired by the transformation, some local kids joined to contribute to their community.

With additional support from Home Depot and partnerships with 20 local organizations, Rock the Block provided a powerful experience for the youth and the residents alike, fostering a renewed sense of pride and connection throughout the neighborhood.




