NETWORK EVALUATION

This year we completed a network evaluation in partnership with the Midwest Center for Nonprofit Leadership (MCNL).

We wanted to know:

Does participation in Youth Volunteer Corps...

- Increase a young person's **life and career skills**?
- Educate and empower **community stewardship**?
- Positively influence a young person's **academic achievement**?
- Positively affect a young person's **mental health**?

A total of 1,138 youth were surveyed.

YOUTH % OF IMPROVEMENT AFTER SERVING WITH YVC

57% "I take action to meet the needs of my community."

53% "I understand the needs of my community."

50% "I understand what jobs are available in my community."

44% "I easily manage my time."

43% "I reflect on my experiences so I perform better in the future."







Project of the Year “Calm Kits”

YVC Charleston, SC partnered with Early College High School to address mental health.

This project was driven by youth. Students conceived the idea and then designed and assembled more than 150 Calm Kits. These kits were filled with mindfulness tools like stress balls, bubbles, and written exercises. They were then shared with peers across local schools.

Through service, the youth of YVC Charleston promoted self-care and connection among their peers. They're continuing their impact with repeat Calm Kit campaigns.

Affiliate of the Year Reading, Pennsylvania

Strong leadership helped YVC Reading engage nearly 1,000 youth through more than 330 service projects—many of them developed and led by youth themselves.

Youth leadership is at the heart of YVC Reading. The STAR (Stand Together Against Racism) initiative, founded by youth in 2020, provides space for meaningful dialogue and advocacy around racial justice. Another youth-led effort, the Youth Mental Health Ambassadors, promotes mental health awareness through peer education, panel discussions, and practical tools that help reduce stigma and offer vital support.

Additional highlights this year included Canstructure, where youth-led teams engineered large-scale structures from canned goods while raising awareness of food insecurity, and the second annual Walk for Compassion, which raised more than \$18,000 for local impact.



YVC Reading creates an environment where youth become compassionate leaders who drive lasting change in their community and beyond.

CONTINUED COMMUNITY: YVC ALUM, BROOKS MORGAN

When Brooks first joined YVC, he had no idea he was laying the groundwork for his future. What began as weekend service projects sparked his interest in construction and real estate that he's now pursuing in college with hopes of using his skills to make a global impact.

"YVC got me out of my comfort zone," Brooks shared. "We worked in areas that needed a lot of help, and I learned and grew from those experiences. That was so beneficial to who I am today."

Those early projects didn't just build confidence, they also introduced him to construction in a hands-on way most middle schoolers never experience. "I'm not sure I'd be a construction student today if I hadn't done YVC," he said. "Touring sites and working on real projects inspired me. There's a lot of cool stuff that goes on."

Now in college, Brooks continues to serve through a service fraternity, carrying YVC's values with him. "When you graduate from YVC, all the principles stick with you," he said. "I'm still volunteering the same way I was at 11. Everything YVC is built upon stays with you."

YVC didn't just shape Brooks' career path, it helped him become a leader ready to make an impact.

BUILDING COMPASSION: ROC SOLID FOUNDATION & NORTHPOINT FOUNDATION

Standout Summer Project: Raising the Stage

This summer, the Ivanhoe Neighborhood Council—a resident-led nonprofit in Kansas City dedicated to building a thriving, connected community—identified a need for an outdoor stage that could bring people together.

Through a powerful partnership, Youth Volunteer Corps youth worked side-by-side with NorthPoint Foundation professionals to construct a versatile outdoor stage designed for concerts, award ceremonies, and community celebrations.

This new space strengthens the neighborhood's infrastructure and creates a welcoming gathering place where youth, families, and community members can connect and grow.



AFFILIATE ON THE RISE: KILLEEN, TX

YVC Killeen joined the network just two years ago as a volunteer-led organization and immediately set out to build a strong youth board to help launch their work. Their adult leaders instilled the value of service early and often, laying the foundation for remarkable growth. In just a few short years, their program has already generated nearly 3,000 volunteer hours.

They are quickly becoming a powerhouse for impact in their community—driven by youth, for youth.

From county-wide projects with parks and recreation departments to community hydroponic gardens, STEAM camps, and more, YVC Killeen embodies commitment and energy. They show that with hard work and heart, big impact can happen fast.



YOUTH VOLUNTEER FEATURE: SADIE

"Service work is incredibly fulfilling, but it also requires a lot from the volunteer. Youth who volunteer make sacrifices; they sacrifice their Saturday mornings, time with their families, or doing something "more fun."

Volunteering is hard at times, but we must also remember the circumstances of the people we are serving. Working out in the hot sun is exhausting, but imagine living in it.

Serving food for a few hours can feel like it drags on forever, but imagine waiting hours to get your one meal for the day. We must remember our privilege and that we are lucky to be able to serve our communities.

We live in a world that is divided, and at times can be very hateful. But all of you are examples of the good in the world, what we could be. You care. You care for your community, your city, your state, your country, your world.

We are the changemakers. The ones who help others and work for what we believe in. Anyone can change the world, but not completely by themselves."

The youth he works with are not only improving their community through service—they are learning that they can lead, innovate, and shape their futures.

With 284 volunteers completing 3,248 hours, Dominic is changing lives. It is about the heart he brings to youth development, the creativity he inspires, and the belief he instills in young people who may have never before been told they can make a difference.

Dominic's leadership is a reminder of the transformative power of service—and of the hope that emerges when youth are given the tools, support, and belief they deserve.



CONTRIBUTION BREAKDOWN:





